

Welcome

The Ravenglass & Eskdale Railway is one of the oldest and longest narrow gauge railways in England, known affectionately as La'al Ratty meaning 'little railway' in olde Cumbrian dialect. The Railway has been operating since 1875, an integral link from the coast to the Eskdale mines at the heart of the UNESCO World Heritage Site, The Lake District National Park. The only coastal village in both UNESCO World Heritage Sites, The Lake District National Park and Hadrian's Wall, Ravenglass was once an important strategic point and coastal defence outpost of Emperor Hadrian. You can visit the remains of Walls Castle, an English Heritage Roman Bathhouse, just a short five minute walk from our station at Ravenglass.



Travel times from key destinations

Glasgow & Edinburgh roughly 150 miles. Drive time approx. 3 hours. Take M6 J40 and follow A66 to Cockermouth, then follow the A595 south to Ravenglass. Train time approx. 3 hours. West Coast Mainline services to Carlisle and change for Northern Rail to Ravenglass station.

York roughly 120 miles. Drive time approx. 3 hours. Take A1 (M) north from York, join A66 to Cockermouth, then follow the A595 south to Ravenglass. Train time approx. 5 hours. Transpennine Express service to Lancaster and change for Northern Rail services to Ravenglass.

Manchester & Liverpool roughly 110 miles. Drive time approx. 3 hours. Take M6 J36 and follow A590 and A595 to Ravenglass. Train time approx. 4 hours. Transpennine Express service to Lancaster and change for Northern Rail services to Ravenglass.

London roughly 310 miles. Drive time approx. 6.5 hours. Take M6 J36 and follow A590 and A595 to Ravenglass. Train time approx. 5 hours. West Coast Main line services to Lancaster and change for Northern Rail services to Ravenglass.









Terms & Conditions



- Please confirm your group numbers seven days prior to visit
- Adult supervision for minors shall be provided by the tour operator/group organiser.
- Smoking is not allowed onboard the train, on the platforms or in the main buildings (including e-cigarettes).
- Passengers may only board and alight when the train is at designated stops.
- The company may cancel or alter travel in the event of emergency, break down, strike, bad weather or for any other reason outside its control, without being liable for any loss of damage.
- 6. No alcohol may be taken onboard the trains.
- The tour operator/group organiser will be responsible for any loss or damage to the locomotive, carriages or the company by any member of their party.
